This reputation is due to s6 of the Care of Children Act 2004 ('COCA') which significantly broadens the scope of how children should be involved in proceedings to which they are subject. However, this paper shows that despite the clear intent of Parliament in enacting

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s6, the practices regarding children's participation have not substantively changed from the prior provision in s23 of the Guardianship Act 1968 ('Guardianship Act').
