B101- 2017 Owner-Architect Agreement

AIA Document B141-1997 represents an entirely new format for an AIA Owner-Architect agreement. It is the result of considerable input and exchange from a number of sources, including round table meetings conducted with owners and architects throughout the country, and contributions from the AIA Practice and Prosperity initiative.

B-Series: Owner/Architect Agreements

B144- 1993. Standard Form of Amendment to the Agreement Between Owner and Architect where the Architect provides Construction Management Services as an adviser to the Owner. AIA Document B144™ARCH-CM–1993 is an amendment to AIA Document B141™-1997 for use in circumstances where the architect, already under contract to perform architectural services for the owner, agrees to provide the owner with a package of construction management services to expand upon, blend with, and supplement ...

B144- 1993 Owner-Architect Amendment for CM Services

B103–2017 is a one-part document that was developed to replace AIA Documents B141™-1997, Parts 1 and 2, and B151™-1997 specifically with respect to large or complex projects. B103–2017 returns to the traditional division of services into Basic and Additional Services. Basic Services are based on five traditional phases: Schematic Design, Design Development, Construction Documents, Bidding or Negotiation, and Construction.

AIA Document B101™-2017 is a standard form of agreement between Owner and Architect for building design and construction contract administration services. B101–2017 requires the Architect to provide the traditional five phases of Basic Services: Schematic Design, Design Development, Construction Documents, Procurement, and Construction.

AIA Document B101–2007 is a one-part standard form of agreement between owner and architect for building design and construction contract administration. AIA Document B101–2007 was developed to replace B141–1997 Parts 1 and 2, and B151–1997 (expired 2009), but it more closely follows the format of B151–1997.

AIA Document B102™-2007 replaces and serves the same purpose as AIA Document B141™-1997 Part 1. AIA Document B102–2007 is a standard form of agreement between owner and architect that contains terms and conditions and compensation details. B102–2007 does not include a scope of architect's services, which must be inserted in Article 1 or attached as an exhibit.

Unlike the B-491 – 1996 document, the A142 – 2004 does not rely on A201 for its general conditions of the contract. Instead, the A142 – 2004 Agreement Between Design-Builder and Contractor contains its own Terms and Conditions; it obligates the contractor to perform the work in accordance with the Contract Documents, which include the A142–2004 with its attached exhibits as well as:
