In *Catching Fish* the monsoon have flooded the streets; fish leap and swim about the delight of a group of little boys, who try their best to catch them, only to encounter a marvellous talking fish who becomes their friend. In *Growing Up* a pair of childhood girl friends find that somehow the years have slipped by, turning them into demure young women. Meera Mukherjee was one of the leading sculptors, whose bronzes, inspired by wax-technique of the tribal dhokra craftsmen, have made her a major name in contemporary Indian art. A multi-faceted personality, she has worked as a cultural anthropologist, studied and practised music, written, sketched and drawn. Her involvement with the life of the village where she did her bronze casting led her to evolving creative and income-generation projects with women and children. Whimsical, impulsive and deeply sensitive, her art moves easily from the physical to the spiritual, from nuanced detail to symbolic abstraction. In this quality of simultaneously inhabiting both the everyday life and fantasy co-exist a child's imagination, that comes to life in this collection of delightful stories, written and charmingly illustrated by her. Simple, tender stories, peopled with children from our cities and from our villages, stories full of wonder and whimsy in which the magical imagination transforms drab reality and becomes another way of seeing it. Her lively sketches and drawings enliven the text, and the result is a set of tales rich in unusual characters lovingly drawn by Meera Mukherjee in this set of unique artist's books marked with her unmistakable personality and style. In the eighteen stories in this retrospective of his best short fiction, Dale Short shows why he is one of the best prose stylists of his generation and why he deserves a break-out success. Short's writing has been hailed by Wally Lamb as "simultaneously mythical and modern; a wild ride," and Dennis Covington has called him "wise and compassionate, a major Southern writer." Stories that have appeared before only in magazines, this collection charts more than two decades of the growth and exploration of an author who won the first Redbook Fiction Prize at the age of twenty-seven, and whose acclaimed novel *The Shining Shining Path* was called by reviewers “Southern magical realism” and praised by *Publishers Weekly* as “boldly imaginative; a provocative spiritual odyssey.” *Publishers Weekly* added, “Short takes risks in a single paragraph that many writers never attempt in an entire novel.”
