This chapter distinguishes three modes of immanence and transcendence with reference to God: cosmological, epistemic, and ethical. Immanence affirms, while transcendence denies that God is contained within the world, and thus within the limits of human reason, or within the norms and resources of human society and culture.

From this perspective, “transcendence” and “immanence” are defined in terms of the everyday work and actions of human beings. Thus, transcendent work includes writing, exploring, inventing, creating, studying, while immanent work includes such work as cooking, cleaning, bureaucratic paper pushing and even biological actions such as giving birth (Veltman 2004).

It is clear that transcendence is a value term expressing the unique excellence of God, because of which worship — utmost devotion or love — is the appropriate attitude toward the being so described. It is less obvious that immanence is a value term, but ubiquity, "being everywhere," comes closer to expressing a unique property. If God is everywhere in the world and also in some sense beyond the world, then God certainly surpasses all ordinary objects of respect or love.

The transcendence we believe in is not the transcendence of deism and the immanence we believe in is not the immanence of pantheism. In the case of deism transcendence virtually means separation while in the case of pantheism immanence virtually means identification. And if we add separation to identification we do not have theism as a result.

Immanence is an antonym of transcendence. As nouns the difference between immanence and transcendence is that immanence is the state of being immanent; inherency while transcendence is (countable) the act of surpassing usual limits.

**What is the difference between immanence and transcendence ...**

A transcendent is one who is beyond perception, independent of the universe, and wholly “other” when compared to us. There is no point of comparison, no points of commonality. In contrast, an immanent God is one which exists within — within us, within the universe, etc. — and, hence, very much a part of our existence.

Immanence and transcendence take their sides but there’s a healthy relationship between the two. Immanence is the balancing concept to God's transcendence, which describes God as being of a completely different kind or substance from and completely independent of the universe He created.

Our sin magnified his transcendence, but our repentance and faith enables a new and deeper immanence. Thus the harsh, cold, arbitrary, aloof and entirely transcendent God of Islam for example is not to be compared with the biblical God. Allah is not Yahweh. Nor are sub-biblical concepts such as those offered by deism.
