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**Passive Vs Active Voice**  
**Active voice means that a sentence has a subject that acts upon its verb. Passive voice means that a subject is a recipient of a verb's action. You may have learned that the passive voice is weak and incorrect, but it isn't that simple. When used correctly and in moderation, the passive voice is fine.**

**In English class, we are taught the difference between active and passive voice. The active voice asserts that the person or thing represented by the grammatical subject performs the action represented by the verb. The passive voice makes the subject the person or thing acted on or affected by the action represented by the verb.**

**Sometimes passive voice is awkward and other times it's vague. Also, passive voice is usually wordy, so you can tighten your writing if you replace passive sentences with active sentence. When you put sentences in passive voice, it's easy to leave out the person or thing doing the action. For example, "Amy is loved," is passive.**

Using active voice for the majority of your sentences makes your meaning clear for readers, and keeps the sentences from becoming too complicated or wordy. Even in scientific writing, too much use of passive voice can cloud the meaning of your sentences.**

**The passive voice sentences turn the text weaker and make it sounds not so appealing. Comparatively, the active voice form of the sentence sounds more meaningful and appropriate. Many of the writers turn active voice sentences into passive voice ones to avoid plagiarism detection in their content.**

**With passive voice, the subject is acted upon by the verb. It makes for a murky, roundabout sentence; you can be more straightforward with active voice. As such, there are many ways to change the passive voice to the active voice in your sentences. Over time, writing in the active voice will become second nature.**

It is generally preferable to use the ACTIVE voice. To change a passive voice sentence into an active voice sentence, simply reverse the steps shown above. 1.**

Passive voice is the voice used when the subject is the recipient of the action. Strong writing uses active voice. Passive voice should only be used in the following instances:**

**Active sentences vs passive sentences** **When A does B, we have two possible ways of talking about it: active or passive. In active sentences A is the subject (before the verb). In passive sentences B is the subject. Check the following examples: Somebody cleaned the classroom yesterday. (Active) The classroom was cleaned every day. (Passive) As you can see, the object of an active sentence is ...**

**Active and Passive Voice - Test English**  
**Teaching active vs passive voice is an important lesson. But it's one that requires a good deal of prerequisites. Before diving into active vs passive voice, I suggest making sure you've covered sentence structure, subjects, nouns, verbs, and prepositions. Without this foundation, your students will likely have a hard time understanding how to correct passive voice errors.**

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**In part, the use of active voice over passive voice is a matter of word economy and simplicity. If you can say something with fewer words, you probably should. It's also a matter of making your words work for you. As Zinsser says, "active verbs push hard and passive verbs tug fitfully."**

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
