The classic Robert Frost poem analysed by Dr Oliver Tearle 'The Road Not Taken' is one of Robert Frost's most famous poems. For this reason, it's natural and understandable that many readers take the poem to be Frost's statement of individualism as a poet: he will take 'the road less travelled'.

This is also the case for Frost's 'Design'. The rhythm is mainly iambic pentameter. This means that each line contains five sets of two beats, known as metrical feet.
